3. Description of Locale:

The parish of San Pedro de Mocomoco is located in the Province of Camacho, in the Department of La Paz, 238 km from the city of La Paz. It is in the inter-Andean valleys at an altitude of 3250 meters. Eighty percent of the population speaks Aymara and the other twenty percent speak Quechua. You can travel to and from La Paz by car or bus, but in the rainy season, the area becomes relatively inaccessible.

The parish serves about 7500 people in 53 communities. It's an area where malnutrition is rampant, and the majority of people live in extreme poverty.

Camacho Province is considered to have the highest poverty rate in the department of La Paz because of various factors: the distance from urban centers that makes any kind of marketing difficult; Abandonment by central government authorities, lack of technical assistance, and disaster relief that does not bring the necessary aid to help in emergencies.

The population are mostly farmers who perform agricultural tasks in a rustic and traditional (oxen and plow) manner; agricultural production is essentially for food that is grown on small plots.

Families have an income of 400 to 700 Bolivianos per year. The exchange rate currently is about 7 bolivianos to the dollar

Our project is intended to benefit 36 of the communities served by the parish.

4. Brief description of the project

The project is an extended mission of evangelization and human promotion, teaching gospel values, Vincentian traditions, and Marian spirituality.

5. Goals and Objectives and Strategy:

General Goal:

In fidelity and obedience to the Holy Spirit, to animate and accompany each baptized person and each community, so that every person might experience the joy, enthusiasm, and fascination of an encounter with the living Jesus so that, through a process of personal and ecclesial conversion, they might respond as missionary disciples in service of the reign of God.

Objetivos específicos:

- Motivated by the Continental Mission in Latin America and the concretization of that mission in Bolivia, "Missionary Disciple: Listen, Learn, Proclaim," that all might take concrete steps to be disciples in mission.
- As Vincnetians, we celebrate the 350th anniversary of the deaths of our founders, and put into practice our call to evangelize the most abandoned.
- Generate greater Christian commitment and practice of Christian values within the family.

Our Missionary Pedagogy.

i. Encounter.

The mission will be realized within an encounter with Jesus, and as together we come to experience the joy of that meeting. For that reason, the mission team will live in the local communities during the time of mission, rather than simple visits for sacramental services. In this way we will come to know better their lives and worries.

ii. Mission

The missionary disciple, as s/he knows and loves the Lord, experiences a need to share with others their joy, and to proclaim Christ crucified and resurrected. The time spent in each community will be a full day, and again for another day in the next month.

The project is intended to benefit 36 communities served by the parish.
